The qualification applies to supervisors and managers who apply a substantial knowledge base and well-developed skills in a wide variety of WHS contexts.

In addition to the meeting the national framework the course has been developed specifically for students who want to expand their knowledge in the rail or major project delivery sectors. Assessment Requirements

Students will be required to complete written knowledge assessments, projects, case studies, work diary, and workplace observation to demonstrate their acquired knowledge and understanding. Students will also be required to respond to case studies and hypothetical scenarios relating to the rail and major project delivery sectors.

Nationally Recognised

On successfully completing the training and assessment, the BSB51319 Diploma of Work Health and Safety qualification will be issued. A transcript listing all units of competency will also be issued. The qualification and units of competency are nationally recognized and provide individuals with a valuable qualification that can be applied throughout Australia. Alium Works will issue a qualification within 30 days of the final assessment being completed.



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Course Delivery & Duration

The Program is delivered 100% online and 1 on 1 mentorship is provided. Students are enrolled for 18 months and will be given access to the Alium Works Learner Managements (LMS) to gain access to course material, quizzes, activities and final assessment material. Enrolment into the course will also include complementary access to the Alium Works Pathway Program.

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Entry Requirements

- **BSBWHS413** Contribute to implementation and maintenance of WHS consultation and participation processes
- **BSBWHS414** Contribute to WHS risk management
- **BSBWHS415** Contribute to implementing WHS management systems
- **BSBWHS416** Contribute to workplace incident response

Learners must meet the following requirements:

- Must be aged 18 years or older.
- Have suitable language, literacy, and numeracy skills to read and comprehend learning materials, complete teamwork, and complete assessment tasks.
- Must supply their own laptop or desktop computer
- Have good computer skills and be able to use Microsoft Office and navigate through the internet.
- Have a stable internet connection.
- Be able to conduct research and present information.
- Photo Identification is required to be sighted prior to course commencement.
- Your computer will need to be enabled with a camera and microphone, live/video streaming Software (e.g. zoom), and must be capable of Microsoft Office and PDF.

Please note: Allium Works will engage with persons expressing interest in enrollment to discuss their language, literacy, and numeracy skills. Allium Works can provide additional learning support to students who require basic assistance. For students who have more fundamental support needs, Allium Works can refer these students to a specialist language, literacy, and numeracy skills to enable them to suitably commence the course



Recognition of Prior Learning

Applicants can apply for recognition of their existing skills and knowledge that are relevant to the units of competency within the program.

These skills and knowledge may have been obtained through workplace training or experience and may reduce the number of units required to be complete during the program.

Students are encouraged to notify Alium Works Training of their interest or intention to apply for RPL prior to their enrolment.
